FORT WORTH

Fort Worth—Where the West Begins!

Like no other city in the United States, Fort Worth captures the spirit and authenticity of the American West. But don't let its rough and tumble beginnings and its "Cowtown" nickname fool you. Fort Worth is shaped by its revitalized downtown center, a world-renowned cultural arts district, and by its beautifully preserved Western-heritage sites.

Sundance Square. Glittering skyscrapers form a ring around Sundance Square, Fort Worth's heralded shopping and entertainment district now restored to its original Victorian beauty, and full of restaurants, theaters, shops, museums, galleries, hotels, and residences.

The Museum Capital of the Southwest. The Kimbell Art Museum — recognized as "America's best small museum" — and the Amon Carter Museum, renowned for its collection of Western and American masterpieces, have garnered worldwide attention for their collections and building designs. The opening of its new building in 2002 made The Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth the second-largest museum of modern art in the country behind the MoMA in New York.

The newly opened National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame honors women who embody the spirit of the

American West, such as painter Georgia O'Keeffe, Western sharpshooter Annie Oakley, author Laura Ingalls Wilder, and former Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor. It is the only museum of its kind in the world. Also located in the Cultural District, is the Fort Worth Museum of Science and History offering exhibits ranging from paleontology to computer science.

Stock Show and Rodeos.

Within walking distance of Fort Worth's celebrated museums is the Will Rogers Memorial Center, which hosts 200 days per year of equestrian and cattle events. The beautiful 114-acre Botanic Garden and Japanese Garden are located nearby as well. Another favorite find in Fort Worth is the Cattle Raisers Museum, located near downtown. It portrays the history of ranching in Texas and the Southwest through interactive displays, dioramas and exhibits.

The Stockyards' Cattle Drive.

The famed Stockyards National Historic District looks much the same today as it did 100 years ago. In fact, the entire avenue is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Catch the Fort Worth Herd, the world's only daily cattle drive, on their twice-daily drive down Exchange Avenue. The authentically restored Grapevine

Vintage Railroad carries visitors into Stockyards Station. Rodeo action and wild west shows take place year-round in the Cowtown Coliseum. The Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame, located in the Stockyards, honors the top cowboys and cowgirls in Texas.

"Texas-Sized" takes on a whole new meaning at Billy Bob's Texas, the "World's Largest Honky-Tonk." This hotspot can hold up to 6,000 people and plays host to country music's top performers. Live bull rid-

ing at Billy Bob's indoor arena thrills visitors each weekend with an up-close perspective on the wildest rodeo event.

In Fort Worth, cowboys and culture do peacefully coexist.

Getting In and Out of Dallas/Fort Worth. Only 17 miles from downtown Fort Worth, Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport (DFW) offers nonstop service to more than 200 cities worldwide. Ground transportation accords travelers immediate access to downtown Fort Worth in a brief 25-minute drive.
