

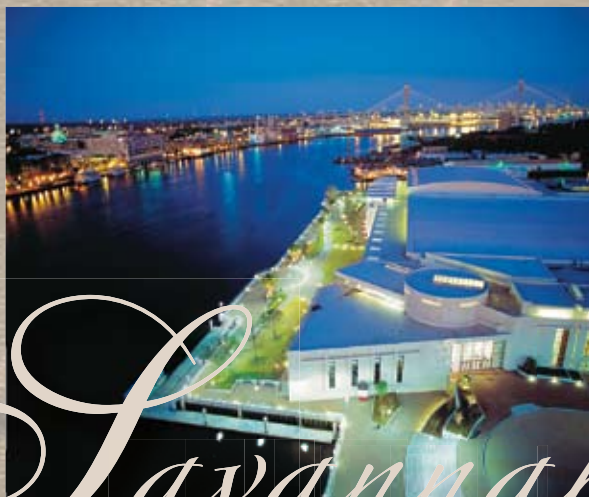

# About Savannah

**WELCOME TO SAVANNAH — GEORGIA'S FIRST CITY,** the sultry and mysterious belle of the Southeastern coast. Her natural beauty, eccentric charm and traditional southern hospitality have captivated suitors for centuries. History, romance, and beauty lie within every nook and cranny of this hidden low country treasure. Here you can experience the history, elegance, and grace of the Old South!

The first to be seduced by this saucy siren was founder General James Edward Oglethorpe. In February 1733, Oglethorpe named the thirteenth and final America colony Georgia — and Savannah became its first city. Ogelthorpe designed the city on a series of grids, creating wide-open streets intertwined with shady public squares and parks. Today the historic district is 2.5-mile walking district full of bistros, quaint shops, green squares and grand architecture.

People fall in love with Savannah. Maybe it's the hospitality, or the quirky personality, or both.

**Telfair Museum of Arts and Sciences.** When a city itself is a work of art, it's not surprising to find it full of artistic and cultural offerings. One of the nation's oldest public museums, the Telfair Museum of Art, now includes a dazzling new complex facing Telfair Square. It encompasses two National Historic Landmark buildings, the Telfair Academy of Arts and Sciences and the Owens-Thomas House, as well as the museum's new building, the Jepson Center for the Arts.

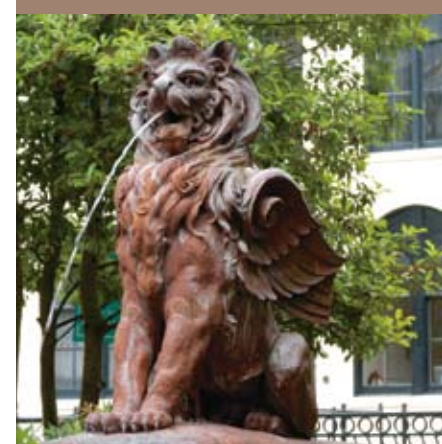
It is surrounded by a wonderland of historic architecture and is only a short walk from the historic King-Tisdell Cottage, and the Ralph Mark Gilbert Civil Rights Museum.

**Tybee Island.** Sand, sea and salty breezes have a charm all their own, but when combined with a dash of history, fresh local cuisine, and an array of outdoor adventures there is a guaranteed draw to Tybee Island. Tybee Island offers an assortment of activities for everyone. Visitors can choose from boat cruises and fishing trips to beach walks and sea animal touch tanks at the Marine Science Center.

After exploring the sites, take time to sample the famous low country cuisine. Fresh bounties from the sea are prepared to perfection by over 30 eclectic restaurants featuring Caribbean flare and American favorites along with fresh local seafood such as crab, oysters, shrimp, and fish.

**Savannah Jazz Festival.** For more than a quarter century, the Savannah Jazz Festival has presented Dixieland, traditional swing, straight-ahead, bop, melodic standards, Latin rhythms and "gutbucket" blues. The SJF promises the best in national, regional and local jazz talent. The week long event begins the last week of September.

**Nightlife.** Hear jazz and blues—or bluegrass. Go salsa or swing dancing. Sing along in a piano bar or puff away in a cigar bar. We don't roll up the sidewalks at sunset in this Southern town. Savannah offers evening tours, outdoor concerts and frequent fireworks and festivals, along with late-night hot spots. Theoretically, you could stay out all night—although we do suggest that you get some sleep to keep up with the daytime fun.
